FRIDAY & WEEKEND COURSES**DRIVER OPERATOR—PUMPER CERTIFICATION
FSC 787.002**

WILL MEET FRIDAY NIGHT AND BOTH SATURDAY & SUNDAY
PREREQUISITES: FIRE FIGHTER I (IFSAC OR PROBOARD), 18 YOA, CURRENT MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSE, EVOC, CERTIFICATE OF PUMP II AND BASIC APPARATUS PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE TRAINING.

This course is for national certification testing for Driver Operator students will be tested on the basic foundation for safe operation of a pumper apparatus through examination of hydraulics, pumping operations, emergency vehicle operation, inspection procedures, and driver evaluation. A written test will be given Friday night with practical skills demonstration on Saturday and Sunday.

**DRIVER OPERATOR—AERIAL CERTIFICATION
FSC 788.002**

WILL MEET FRIDAY NIGHT AND BOTH SATURDAY & SUNDAY
PREREQUISITES: FF-1 (IFSAC OR PROBOARD), 18 YOA, EVOC, AERIAL OPERATIONS, BASIC APPARATUS PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE TRAINING, AND CURRENT MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSE

This test is for national certification testing to NFPA 1002 Driver Operator-Aerial. Candidates will be tested on the basic foundation of safe operation of an aerial device through examination of emergency vehicle operations, inspection procedures, driver evaluation, aerial operations and emergency procedures. A written exam will be given Friday night with practical skills testing on Saturday and Sunday.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS**EMERGENCY RESPONSE TO AMMONIA AND CHLORINE INCIDENTS
FSC 757.002**

PREREQUISITES: IAFF HAZ MAT OPERATIONS OR NFPA 472 HAZ MAT OPERATIONS
 In this course students will learn the hazards associated with ammonia and chlorine releases. This course will cover protection measures designed to control the impact of exposures to life and property. Emphasis is placed on personal protective equipment, instrumentation, and scene management.

GEAR: NONE

FIRE GROUND OPERATIONS**FORCIBLE ENTRY****FSC 700.002 TFE**

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING OR EXTERIOR FIRE FIGHTER
MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE TO REGISTER FOR THIS PROGRAM!

This course will provide the fire fighter with a better understanding of building construction. Also covered are opening techniques and the use of tools for safe and quick access into a structure.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, GOGGLES OR SAFETY GLASSES (HELMET FACE SHIELDS ARE NOT SUFFICIENT EYE PROTECTION!)

ATTENTION! THERE IS AN ADDITIONAL \$65.00 LAB FEE FOR EXPENDABLE ITEMS TO BE CUT AND FORCED FOR THIS PROGRAM. A TOTAL OF \$130.00 PER STUDENT TO ENROLL IS REQUIRED WHEN YOUR REGISTRATION FORM IS SUBMITTED.

FIRE GROUND OPERATIONS**HIGH RISE FIRE FIGHTING****FSC 537.002 HIRI**

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING, TRUCK CO. OPERATIONS I, ICS
 This course will provide the instruction in fighting fires in high rise buildings. The special problems encountered by the fire fighter in this type of fire are also discussed. Safe operations and the use of a tactical checklist and application of the Incident Command System are stressed.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

ENGINE COMPANY OPERATIONS**FSC 205.002 ECOP**

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING or FF—1 CERTIFICATION or INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTING (ELIF)

This course provides instruction in the duties and responsibilities of an engine company. Topics include: fire behavior and spread in structures, positioning of apparatus, use of attack and backup lines, search and rescue, and water supply. A series of hands-on drills involving various engine company evolutions follows the classroom discussion.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

TRUCK COMPANY OPERATIONS I**FSC 209.002 TRCO**

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING or INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTER (ELIF)

This course will introduce the student to the basic duties of a truck company including hand and power tool operation, search and rescue, and ventilation. Truck Company support to Engine Company is also covered.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

FIRE FIGHTER SURVIVAL (must be 18 on first day of class)**FSC 202.002 SURV**

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING or INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTING (ELIF) PLUS RITC, SFR, NICS-FS OR or NICS-EMS or ICS

This course is a comprehensive program dealing with the necessary knowledge and skills relative to rescue procedures needed for self-rescue. Emphasis will be placed on search techniques, communications, accountability/location and self-rescue procedures.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, PASS DEVICE, SCBA WITH SPARE CYLINDER

THERMAL IMAGING for the Fire Service**FSC 603.002**

PREREQUISITES: EBM, SBS, AND MUST BE 18 YOA

This 16hr program will provide the knowledge needed to properly interpret an image produced by a thermal imager. Topics discussed include how to search a building with a thermal imager, what pitfalls to avoid and how different types of technologies, work their advantages and disadvantages.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

LIVE FIRE EVOLUTIONS PROHIBIT JUNIOR FIRE FIGHTERS FROM REGISTERING FOR THIS COURSE

INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE**FSC 459.002**

PREREQUISITES: NONE

The goal of this 16hr. program is to equip entry level firefighters with basic knowledge, skills, and abilities to begin their fire service career. Through classroom sessions and practical fieldwork, the recruit/new firefighter will learn how to function safely and effectively as a support member of a fire suppression organization. This course is designed to introduce new firefighters to basic information including an overview of the fire service, fire service organization, firefighter safety, personal protective equipment and terrorism awareness. This is the first of four courses in the curriculum.

MANAGEMENT / COMMAND / INSTRUCTOR

INCIDENT SAFETY OFFICER

Certification Optional at end with proper prerequisites

FSC 108.002 ISO NFA

PREREQUISITES: ICS or NIMS for Fire Service, Haz Mat Operations, and 18 YOA!

**For Certification you will also need Fire Company Officer I (IFAC and ProBoard)

This course focuses on the duties of the person in the role of the responding safety officer at the scene of an incident. It is an incident specific, scene oriented course designed to teach what a safety officer needs to know and be able to do, using scenarios to convey instructional points. Students should be experienced company officers, familiar with safety issues, the Incident Command System, hazardous materials incident management, and applicable NFPA standards and federal regulations.

GEAR: NONE

INTRODUCTION TO UNIFIED COMMAND FOR MULTI-AGENCY CATASTROPHIC INCIDENTS

FSC779.002 NFA

PREREQUISITES: COMPLETION OF NFA STUDY GUIDE RECOMMENDED

This course will prepare students from emergency response organizations to understand and apply the concepts of incident command and unified command in their communications.

GEAR: NONE

ARSON DETECTION FOR THE FIRST RESPONDER

FSC 734.002 ADFR NFA

PREREQUISITES: NONE

Upon successful completion the student will be able to provide a clear definition of the role of initial responder organizations and to provide essential knowledge to enable them to recognize the potential of an intentionally set fire, preserve evidence, and properly report the information to appropriate officials.

GEAR: NONE

BUILDING CONSTRUCTION WOOD/ORDINARY—NFA

FSC 780.002 BCP

PREREQUISITES: IST or INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE (ELIS)

The failure of building components under fire conditions is a leading cause of firefighter death and injury. The ability to recognize, locate, and "read" critical information about a building before a fire breaks out is critical to suppression efforts and firefighter safety. This course prepares the student to accomplish these skills in buildings constructed of wood frame and ordinary construction.

GEAR: NONE

ICS FOR STRUCTURAL COLLAPSE INCIDENTS

FSC 677.002 ICSSI NFA

PREREQUISITES: ICS

Upon completion of this course, the student will have a better understanding of command operations at structural collapse incidents. This course is intended for fire command officers.

GEAR: NONE

LEGAL ASPECTS FOR THE FIRE SERVICE

FSC 232.002 LAFS

PREREQUISITES: NONE

This course will increase the student's knowledge of the various statutes, case law decisions, and ordinances that directly affect the operation of the volunteer fire, rescue, or ambulance organizations.

GEAR: NONE

APPARATUS OPERATIONS

PUMP OPERATIONS I

FSC 420.002 PUOP

PREREQUISITES: IST OR INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE AND 18 YOA!

This course provides the fire fighter with an introduction to basic pump construction and theory as well as operating techniques. Emphasis is placed on getting water to the pump, getting water from the pump to hose streams, and prevention of common mistakes in pump operations.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR

RESCUE OPERATIONS

BASIC VEHICLE RESCUE OPERATIONS

FSC 177.002 BVRO

PREREQUISITES: BASIC VEHICLE RESCUE AWARENESS-MUST BE 16 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

This module is intended for those responders WHO have already completed the awareness level course. This course teaches the student the use of hand tools as they relate to vehicle extrication and how to quickly and safely access and package patients for removal from damaged vehicles

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR – EYE PROTECTION – SAFETY GLASSES OR GOGGLES

FOR EMS CON ED UNITS SEE CHART

TRENCH RESCUE II

FSC 322.002

PREREQUISITES: TRENCH RESCUE I, CONFINED SPACE RESCUE, MUST BE 18YOA
This course is a continuation of Trench Rescue I with the additional knowledge and skills for shoring intersecting trenches, such as X, L, T trenches, ICS and team building is included in the field evaluation evolutions.

GEAR: HELMET WITH CHIN STRAP (fire, construction or climbing helmet), EYE PROTECTION (safety glasses or goggles), LEATHER GLOVES, WORK OR HIKING BOOTS, OUTDOOR WORK CLOTHING OR COVERALLS.

FIRE FIGHTING TURNOUT GEAR IS NOT SUITABLE FOR THIS CLASS.

FOR EMS CON ED UNITS SEE CHART

RAPID INTERVENTION TEAM ADVANCED TRAINING

FSC 770.002

PREREQUISITES: R.I.T. BASIC TRAINING, SURV, EBM, MUST BE 18 YOA

This course will review the Basic R.I.T. Team Exercises including size up, new techniques for locating and removing trapped and injured firefighters, information regarding recent fire fighter fatalities, and recent R.I.T. survival accounts, as well as, current R.I.T. developments. Also included is a review of forcible entry techniques including forcible entry equipment with special emphasis on building collapse.

GEAR: TOG AND SCBA

FOR EMS CON ED UNITS SEE CHART

ROPE/HIGH ANGLE RESCUE I

FSC 340.002 RORE

PREREQUISITES: IST or INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE

Students in this course will be re-introduced to the various types of rope and related rescue equipment. Students will be trained in tying of basic knots and hitches used in rope rescue, basic rappelling techniques, tie-offs, self-rescue, basic litter handling skills. Much of the program is hands-on and time is allotted for practice in order to build proficiency.

GEAR: HELMET WITH CHIN STRAP (fire, construction or climbing helmet), EYE PROTECTION, CLEAN LEATHER GLOVES, WORK OR HIKING BOOTS, OUTDOOR WORK CLOTHING OR COVERALLS. FIRE FIGHTER TURNOUT GEAR IS NOT APPROPRIATE FOR THIS CLASS.

(Helmet face shields are not suitable eye protection)

STUDENTS WILL ALSO NEED A 15 FOOT SECTION OF ROPE AND A 15 FOOT PIECE OF TUBULAR WEBBING FOR KNOT PRACTICE.

ELEVATOR AND ESCALATOR RESCUE EMERGENCIES

FSC 572.002

PREREQUISITES: NONE

This course is intended for the technician level rescuer to give them the ability to function accurately, safely, and efficiently during elevator incidents involving this mode of transportation. Topics include: hazard assessment and size-up, resource management considerations, equipment identification, types of emergency responses, patient considerations, extrication procedures, crush syndrome, lockout/tag out, pre-incident planning, and application of techniques and equipment through simulated integrated exercises. (BCCC Certificate)

3 COURSE HAZARDOUS MATERIALS PACKAGE

FSC 910.002

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS AWARENESS

RIHM

PREREQUISITES: NONE

This course will provide instruction in the basic skills of identifying hazardous material problems in a community, recognizing hazardous materials presence, identify hazardous materials, and the associated hazard characteristics.

GEAR: NONE

STUDENTS WHO SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETE THIS COURSE MAY TEST TO RECEIVE HAZARDOUS MATERIALS AWARENESS PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION

HAZARDOUS BIOLOGICAL AGENTS

PREREQUISITES: NONE

Hazardous biological agents and their toxic chemical by products seem to instill an especially elevated level of fear in man. As the result of their resistance to being readily detected and rapidly identified, these invisible, self replication microorganisms and the disease conditions that they cause pose an especially insidious threat and cause widespread panic. Realistic scenarios will be used to illustrate subject material covered in the course.

GEAR: NONE

HAZARDOUS CHEMICAL AGENTS

PREREQUISITES: NONE

This course presents a detailed discussion of those specific properties of certain chemicals of both the weapon and industrial types, which contribute to their attractiveness to a terrorist. The course will also examine their extremely hazardous nature to personnel involved in the interdiction of and response to chemical incidents whether these situations are the result of an accident or terrorist attack.

GEAR: NONE

SAFETY PACKAGE

FSC 911.002

PERSONAL ACCOUNTABILITY SYSTEMS

PREREQUISITES: NONE

This course is a comprehensive program dealing with the necessary knowledge and skills relative to accountability systems. Commonly used accountability systems and technologies are presented for the student to evaluate and study for possible use within their department. A Bucks County Community College continuing education certificate will be issued.

GEAR: NONE

PREPARING FOR AND PREVENTING LINE OF DUTY DEATHS

PREREQUISITES: NONE

This course enable students to examine methods to prepare for and prevent fire-service line of duty deaths by reviewing their established standards and procedures.

BLOOD-BORNE PATHOGENS, INFECTIOUS DISEASE AND BIOLOGICAL AGENT REVIEW

PREREQUISITES: INITIAL BLOOD-BORNE PATHOGENS TRAINING

This course reviews infection control and biological human disease recognition and prevention practices for emergency and non-emergency public service agencies.

FSC 242.002

FIPO

PREREQUISITES: NONE

This course sets forth the need for fire police; their legal police power; personal and professional qualifications; their appointment and control; their general and special duties; and their limitations.

PREREQUISITES: EMT-B or EMT-P

SCENE SIZE-UP AND INITIAL ASSESSMENT

BUREAU OF FORESTRY TRAINING

BASIC WILDLAND FIRE FIGHTER – PA 130

FSC 632.002

WBFF

PREREQUISITES: NONE

This course will provide the student with the knowledge and skills needed to become a wildland fire fighter. Topics include: Organization and Fire Fighter Preparedness, Fire Fighting Tools, Suppression, Securing the Line, Mop-up, Overhaul, and Safety.

GEAR: FIRE, CONSTRUCTION OR CLIMBING HELMET WITH CHIN STRAP, EYE PROTECTION SUCH AS SAFETY GLASSES OR GOGGLES, LEATHER GLOVES, WORK OR HIKING BOOTS, OUTDOOR WORK CLOTHING OR COVERALLS.

FIRE FIGHTING TURN OUT GEAR IS NOT SUITABLE FOR THIS CLASS.

JUNIOR FIRE FIGHTERS

JUNIOR FIREFIGHTER BASIC TRAINING SEMINAR

FSC 553.002

PREREQUISITES: IST OR INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE

Through classroom sessions and practical exercises, this course will give the new junior firefighter the ability to perform very basic support skills, safely and effectively as a member of a fire suppression organization. This program will cover basic fire chemistry, hose construction and loads, PPE, basic ladder identification, ladder carries and raises, basic equipment identification and application. This course does not meet or exceed the Pa. State Fire Academy Delmar Series of programs and can not be used as a prerequisite for any other program.

(BCCC Certificate)

GEAR: Turn Out Gear

PRE-REGISTRATION INFORMATION

PREREGISTRATION DEADLINE IS SEPTEMBER 12, 2008

Applicants must be proper year of age for certain courses and an active insured member of an emergency services organization. All students must be authorized by their chief or supervisor to attend. Junior fire fighters may not enroll in any course which involves live fire or live fire smoke. The Pennsylvania State Fire Academy policy on facial hair will be strictly adhered to.

The basic fee for the CAFCA Fire College Weekend is \$65.00 which includes lunch and refreshments both days. Any student who is not a resident of Pennsylvania must pay an additional \$40.00 (\$105.00 total). Professional Certification for Driver Operator Pumper or Aerial Certification has an additional fee \$140.00/student in addition to the basic weekend fee. Also Forcible Entry class has an additional lab fee of \$65.00/student in addition to the registration fee. All registrations must be accompanied by a check or money order drawn to B.C.C.C. or a credit card account number with three digit security code from the back of the card or department purchase order number.

No telephone registrations will be accepted. Only students paying by credit card or company/department purchase order may fax their registration to 215-343-6794. Pre-registration is necessary and should be done EARLY. Class sizes are limited in number and are filled on a first come basis. Students are requested to select up to three of the two day seminars in order of priority. Applicants should only select courses that they desire to be enrolled in.

ANY COURSE MAY BE CANCELLED DUE TO INSUFFICIENT ENROLLMENT OR OTHER CIRCUMSTANCES.

In case of course cancellation or if a course is filled, students are automatically placed in the next class choice indicated on the registration form. If another choice is not indicated on the form, the student's registration fee will be returned. Students will be notified of course cancellations or any other changes as soon as possible. If a student cancels his/her registration, no refunds will be honored after September 12, 2008. Enrollments will be accepted after this deadline and walk-ins for courses with available seats.
