



Clinton County Natural Gas Task Force

Meeting Minutes

December 14, 2010

The meeting was called to order by Commissioner Adam Coleman.

Mr. Kevin Fanning provided a report for the Public Safety Committee. There has been no change to the current number of pad locations in Clinton County. There are still thirty-four (34) pad sites accounting for twenty-six (26) physical addresses.

There will be another offering in Clinton County, of the Pennsylvania State fire Academy (PSFA) "Wellsite Emergency Response" program. The course will be offered at the Kettle Creek Hose Company in Cross Fork. The course is scheduled for March 2, 2011. Mr. Fanning will share the course information electronically once it is received from PSFA.

The Department of Emergency Services continues to work with the school districts and industry to facilitate a meeting to discuss potential concerns relevant to truck traffic and school bus traffic. School bus routing information has been received from both Keystone Central and Jersey Shore Area School Districts. This information was passed along to industry for review prior to the establishment of a meeting. Mr. Fanning hopes to have a meeting scheduled for shortly after the start of the New Year.

The Public Safety Committee has held its first Exercise Design meeting. The goal is to conduct a table top exercise sometime over the winter months and follow-up with a full-scale exercise in early spring.

The Public Safety Committee will not meet again until January 20, 2011.

Mr. Mike Flanagan provided a report for the Economic Development Committee. He reported that they have developed a property list of 25 properties that gas companies might be interested in.

Mr. Richard Kyle provided a report for the Public Education Committee. He thanked Mr. Jim Ladlee for undertaking a lot of the work. They have had seven radio programs and sixteen newspaper articles have been written and published in the Lock Haven Express. He also thanked Ms. Julie Brennan and Mr. Matt Henderson for their help. There will be a Meet and Greet at Haywoods on January 26, 2011 for gas companies and local businesses. There are several sponsors for the event. Gas Task Force members, elected officials, and partnership members will be invited.

Ms. Brennan reported that the Green Energy Fair was held recently and over 300 people attended. Mr. Ladlee had a display on Marcellus shale. Representative Hanna and Senator Wozniak sponsored the event.

Mr. Gerry Lacy provided a report for the Environmental Committee. He reported that they are discussing water related issues, regulations and well standards, and how they relate to private property and rivers and streams.

Mr. Bruce Jones provided a report for the Workforce Development Committee. He reported that there have been 135 hires related to the gas industry. The majority of these hires were for TRICAN who continues to hire steadily.

Anadarko representatives provided an update. Ms. Mary Wolfe reported that construction has not started at the Chapman Township water withdrawal site. There is a lot of activity in Grugan Township. Mr. Matt Carmichael reported that they are producing 211 million cubic feet per day with a net production of 43 million cubic feet per day. 18 million are produced in Clinton County. 28 wells are waiting on completion. There have been 22 wells drilled in Clinton County, 33 drilled in Lycoming, and 12 in Centre County. They have spent \$50 million on road improvements. It was asked if Anadarko would be willing to have meeting with folks to discuss how water supplies would be protected when drilling under water supplies. Anadarko is willing to meet; therefore, Mr. Dan Vilello offered to help set up the meeting.

Mr. Vilello, DEP, reported that the new well casing regulations have been enacted. The new permit changes will have a huge impact on development. Permit costs will help Conservation Districts. Currently there is 10,000 miles of pipeline infrastructure in Pennsylvania.

The next Task Force Meeting will be held on January 25, 2011 at 4:00 PM in the Commissioners' Meeting room.
